In October there were a couple of **Pop-up Jams** when the weather cooperated, usually 9-14 people. The last one held at Linda Osgood's attracted hundreds.... of birds... that is. They only stayed for Southwind and then flew in that direction. But they were loud, none had dampers and they did not socially distance either.

The **October Spirit Jam** went live on October 22. About 125 actively participated. It lasted about 1 hour and 40 minutes. Many joined in the conversation thread, enjoying, greeting and conversing with each other. There are now 249 "official" members of this FB group. Some have also become members of SSDS. Angleworm Wiggle and Cincinnati Hornpipe are new favorites for some. It was a joyous jam with a Halloween theme.

**November Spirit Jam** will take place November 19. The theme is **Gratitude and Thanksgiving**. SSDS members whose last name begins with M through R get to choose a tune and email their choice to me by November 6. Think of those tunes that make you happy and bring you joy. The photo collage will have a Thanksgiving theme, so start gathering a cornucopia of Thanksgiving symbols for your photo.

October seemed to be a month that forced us to use new ways to share music:

- Our last outdoor performance was at Brookhaven Manor Apartments in Ann Arbor. COVID requirements meant that only 6 of us were allowed to come. The day was sunny but chilly and VERY windy. We started late to allow the lawn mowing crew to clear from the area. It seemed strange to be so far from our audience, but all in all they enjoyed it. They told us they would miss not seeing us during the Christmas holidays.
- OUR FIRST VIDEO ONLY PERFORMANCE - Plymouth Library contracted us to do a fall performance via ZOOM. When that was unable to happen, they asked if we could provide them with a video performance. We agreed even though this presented

some challenges – finding a place we could do this safely with little or no noise from cars, planes, trains or squeaky swings; availability of enough players and a good mix of instruments; someone to do the recording; a good weather day; and playing to an audience that was not there physically. Somehow it all came together (THANK YOU EVERONE WHO PARTICIPATED). Dave Smith created the video, added some great touches and sent the link to the library. The program coordinator is very pleased with it – so AMEN to 2020 performances.

## CHRISTMAS IS COMING!



Normally we would be busy rehearsing and fine-tuning our Christmas Music line-up. COVID-19 has put the kibosh on that. So what are we to do? I have an idea, but it means you will have to rehearse and practice the tunes on your own. Each week, you will be given 3 tunes to work on. Some we have performed in the past, others may be new. You can view/listen to tunes SSDS has performed on the Silver Strings YouTube channel. Last year's concert at the Livonia Library is there, as are tunes from previous years.

This year all tunes must be in Public Domain so we can use them at a Christmas themed spirit jam and avoid or eliminate any copyright issues.

If you play different instruments – try the tunes on those, add harmony or different rhythmic touches. If you have played during the holiday season with SSDS, you know we bring out all the bells, whistles, clackers, and different types of instruments we have. So use them in some way and have fun. If a new tune is introduced, I will try to post a "Practice Video" to help learn it.

**October 25-31** – Over the River/Jingle Bells Medley (G); I Saw Three Ships/Christmas is in the Air Medley (G); O Come All Ye Faithful (G)

**November 1-7:** Winter Waltz (Am) (Play it AAB, AAB, ABA – use second ending last time only) The Holly and the Ivy/ (G), Deck the Halls (G) Medley 2/3; *Play the Holly and the Ivy more slowly as if you are sorting through your decorations deciding what to put up – then speed up for Deck the Halls.*

**November 8-14: Besancon (D)**; Star of the East (G) We Three Kings/Carol of the Bells Medley (Am)
