MUSIC CHANGES: I am in the midst of reviewing the club's music. Some of the After Hours tunes are being moved into the regular repertoire. Some of the tunes shared at After Hours have not yet been put into Dropbox. And there are a few tunes that need to be re-tagged. The Table of Contents and Music Revision list have been updated through October. Check Dropbox regularly to make sure you have the most recent version and all the music. Since the Spirit Jams, COVID and the active After Hours jams, the music has gotten ahead of me. If something appears to be missing, send me a note so I can follow up on it. While I am at it, if you notice something that needs "fixing" – like an incorrect chord, a missing or wrong note, etc., make a copy of the tune, circle the item and give it to me.

Practice Tune Videos— There are 90 practice videos in the "library." The latest one is Apples, Peaches, Pumpkin Pie. These are a learning tool to help new players become familiar with "official" SSDS tunes.

Holiday Music Preparation. Thank you to everyone who came out on Oct. 26 for the second practice. It is great to see all the support for our performances. We focused on proposed new tunes and worked on starts.

Thank you for your patience with me while I try to juggle all the elements in building this year's program. Your comments and questions helped me finetune and work out details. O Holy Night is out. The consensus was to hold off on the other new tunes until the final rehearsal. There are 23 tunes left on the working playlist. The list has to be pared down to 20 or 21 tunes. It may be that we keep all the tunes and decide at a particular playdate which tunes to cut based on the mix and number of players and the

venue requirements (background music, full concert, hybrid, i.e., Advent programs which require a mix of background and performance). There will be two playlists. One is for the requested secular music program requested for Wayne County Community College. The other will be used at the rest of the programs.

The last rehearsal is Thursday, November 9 at 6:30 p.m. This is a "dress" rehearsal. Bring your "decorations" for your instrument or stand, your accessories that may be used in various pieces (hats, jingle bells, whistles, triangles, clackers, etc.) Make sure you have the most recent version of the music and playlist. We will set up as if we were at a performance and go through the entire list from top to bottom.

Spirit Jam #32 – November 28th at 7:00 on Facebook Live. Enjoy playing together in the comfort of your own home. The theme is in honor of the 40th anniversary of SSDS and is based on the recent SSDS favorite tune survey.

We were playing at a recent After-Hours Jam and Scott told us he is friends with Randy. One thing led to another. Voila! I will be transcribing this tune into SSDS format soon. 
