**Playing in August** – SSDS was truly on the road – from Frankenmuth, to New Baltimore, to Grosse IIe. We had enthusiastic audiences and a lot of fun. Some outstate members joined us which was great. Photos and videos were posted on Facebook.

**Midland reflections** – Our meeting area, aka, Jam Tent, was centrally located and in use much of the time with a Uke jam in the morning, afternoon MD jam and 3-hour evening jam, followed by 1-3 hour fast jam. Saturday, we heard music til 2:30 a.m. David Haas, MD player extraordinaire, graced us with his singing and playing. The "All God's Critter's Jam" brought lots of laughs as

we played old and new tunes that had a critter's name in the title. Have you played "Sally Smacked Me with a Flounder"?

SSDS was well-represented as several SSDS people led workshops and volunteered at the registration tent, stage show, etc.

**MUSIC LIBRARY:** Check Dropbox and keep your music updated. Unfamiliar tunes shared at Evart and Midland will be added to the library 'After Hours' section. While they may not become part of the "official" repertoire, you will have them for the next festival or other jam group. If you picked up a new tune at a workshop or jam you think SSDS would enjoy, give me a copy to add to the library. *NOTE: Copyrighted tunes in the jam library will not be added to a performance list but can be enjoyed at a jam.* 



PLEASE HELP WITH THE PRACTICE TUNE VIDEO PROJECT! The goal is to build the library to 100 tunes. It is at 87. Pick a tune to work on before September. The format is to announce the tune and the key you are playing. Demonstrate it by playing through at tempo. Then break down the A part phrase by phrase. Play through Part A. Next, break down part B the same way. Play through it. Then play the entire tune slowly. Repeat the tune at the usual tempo. Be part of the "recording session" that will be scheduled this fall. I am asked at every festival if we have a video for a particular tune. This project can only grow with your help.

Holiday Music Preparation. Thank you to everyone who came to the Christmas music review session before the Club picnic. Your comments were helpful as we tried out various tunes and talked about instrumentation, arrangements, etc. There are 5 tunes or medleys that will be added if we can learn them: O Holy Night – C (would be our feature tune). The challenge will be in counting. The proposed arrangement will help in that regard. Christmas in Killarney appears to be an early favorite and would feature our great whistle players. The Marvelous Toy would replace Santa Is Coming to Town - is there someone who could/would create a marvelous toy to be a visual focal point? Heiah Ho/Patapan medley is in a minor key and has some cool possibilities; Still, Still Still/Oh Christmas Tree medley - I envision the MDs/autoharps starting this piece with the rest of us building upon it.

Besides working on these new tunes, please let me know if you intend to perform any of the holiday performances. There are 8 scheduled performances so far, from late November through December 21. **Michigan Festivals** – We are fortunate to have two great traditional music festivals in our state: The ODPC Funfest in Evart and the Midland Folk Music Festival in Midland. The support we give these festivals helps keep them going. In the past few years, some festivals have called it quits for a number of reasons. Membership has dropped critically or insufficient attendance or volunteers to make it a go.

Being a member, volunteering and voting are important to the vitality of the clubs and festivals. If you are not a member of ODPC or Midland Folk Society, I encourage you to become one. Like SSDS, ODPC will be electing people to leadership. Two people running for Trustee are our own Cindy Semrau and Mary Jensen. Midland is also experiencing a change in leadership. They are seeking a Stage Show Manager.
