Holiday Music Preparation: The "dress rehearsal," i.e., last practice, is **November 14**. We will sit as if we are giving the performance and go through the entire playlist. If there is time, we will also run through the secular list tunes that will be performed at Wayne County CC. Please note that the tune lists must sometimes be adjusted at performances. So be flexible, pay attention and mark your music if needed. Preparing to Perform - Playing during the holidays requires our taking it up a notch. Holiday Dress means to wear something with the colors associated with the season. You may wear a lighted necklace – but no blinking lights. Everyone is expected to "decorate" their stand or instrument with an ornament or stocking or garland. Make sure you tune your instrument before coming to the performance. Practice smiling or at least looking up to smile after a tune. We bring musical joy to our audiences in our appearance, our demeanor and our tunes.

Holiday Performances - even if you are not performing with the group, please promote these concerts and invite your friends, family, and other groups. Post the list on your FB page, your church or community bulletin board. A good audience feeds our enthusiasm and elevates the level of our playing.

Personal Tune of the Month – Have you tried Zelda's Jig or Dutchman's Waltz? They are the newest tunes in the library. It is a good musical habit to always be working on a tune – especially one you don't know very well. We have almost 300 tunes in the library. Pull one out and make it part of your personal playlist. If you have trouble picking one out – choose one from the January playlist. You could also listen to one of the SSDS performances in the club's YouTube channel and pick a tune from there.

After Hours Jam - has started up again. Stay and play. The group plays all variety of tunes, not just those in the "official" repertoire. It helps in considering and learning tunes that may "graduate" to the official directory.

Spirit Jam #34 – It is my hope to do another Spirit Jam on Facebook Live January 23, 2025 dedicated to Terry. Terry and I had to cancel a planned Spirit Jam in January. With the help of some friends, this may be able to happen one more time. The playlist will come out next month. I hope you will set that day aside to be part of this. January is usually a dark and gray month. This type of jam allows everyone to connect within the comfort of their home, regardless of distance and weather. Let's light it up with a joyful evening of music. Invite your music friends to join us. "Starters" practice group - This four-month project starts in January. It is intended to give players practice starting tunes. Being able to confidently start a tune the musical capabilities not only of the individual but of the group. While focused on HD players, it will be open to any instrument, the greater variety of instruments starting a tune enhances the music. What are your favorite jam tunes? Are you able to start them? Play around with them. Make a list of a few tunes you wish or would like to start. January is not that far away. Make it an intention to begin the new year learning a new skill.
